# BID BUSINESSES EMBRACING TASTE AND ALE TRAILS

BID Businesses will be welcoming food and drink fans through their doors as part of the Taste and Ale Trails at this month's Stratford Town Centre Food Festival.

Sponsored by local restaurant Loxleys, the festival is a celebration of regional food and drink with an action-packed timetable of demonstrations and workshops alongside a bustling market through Stratford's streets, as well as the popular Trails.

This year, more than 30 town businesses are involved in the Trails - with two different Taste Trails on each day of the festival plus an Ale Trail each day too.

Participants include a range of hotels, restaurants, cafes and pubs ranging from independent businesses to big name brands. The recently-rebranded Crowne Plaza is taking part for the first time, as is Veeno The Italian Wine Cafe - one of the new arrivals to Bell Court.



Taste Trail as a great opportunity to welcome the public into the hotel and sample a few tasty sweet and savoury treats.



"From Sunday Lunch to afternoon teas to cocktails on the riverside terrace, we want our hotel to be on the food map for everyone visiting the town."

Also taking part in the trails are independent Stratford businesses including Union Bar, The Riverbank and Vigour Cafe.

Manoj Tugnait, who owns The Riverbank, said: "This is the first year we'll be involved in the festival, after

only starting trading in Easter. We can't wait to get involved -

it's a great event for the town and being part of a trail gives us the chance to bring people across the river and show them what we offer at The Riverbank."

The Trails will also see the launch of a brand new beer at The Golden Bee on Sheep Street. The new beer, Hop Star from Solihull-based Silhill Brewery, will be on offer at the Golden Bee as part of the Ale Trail, marking the national launch of the beer and will be the first time it's available for public consumption.

Our quarterly networking event returns next week, with the Food Festival, Christmas and security all on the agenda.



### TRUST MARKS 170 YEARS SINCE PURCHASE OF BIRTHPLACE

You might have seen that Shakespeare's Birthplace is set to go under the hammer this weekend. But no need to worry - it's all part of the 170th anniversary of the purchase of the Birthplace, which saved it for the nation.

To mark the anniversary, the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust is putting on a re-enactment of the auction this Saturday (September 16th) alongside an exhibition to tell the story of the how the world-famous birthplace was preserved.

The re-enactment will take place outside the Birthplace on Henley Street at 12pm and 2pm on Saturday, where visitors can enjoy a free performance recreating the events of 170 years ago.

A temporary exhibition in the Shakespeare Centre, which runs until December 29th, will tell how public figures of the day including Prince Albert, Charles Dickens and Sir Robert Peel joined a committee to solicit public subscription to help save Shakespeare's Birthplace from dissolution and decay.

# TOWN TRUST LAUNCHES DIY SOS STYLF INITIATIVE FOR STRATEORD



The Stratford Town Trust is on the lookout for a project to help as part of its own 'DIY SOS-style' ReBuild initiative.

The Trust is looking for nominations for worthy projects to help as part of the scheme, which aims to have a direct and lasting impact within Stratford.

From a house in need of alterations to allow a disabled or ill family member to stay in their own home to a community facility in desperate need of saving or reinvigorating, the Trust wants to give the chosen project the full "ReBuild" treatment.

Anyone can nominate a project – the only criteria is that it must happen within Stratford. **Justin Williams, Chief Executive of Stratford Town Trust, said: "We want to identify a project in** need of support; a project that will have a measurable impact, to the recipients and to the broader community.

"We're not embarking on this with any preconceived ideas, in terms of what the best project will be – it is up to the residents of Stratford to nominate and then vote. What we're saying is let us know about a really good local project that we can support, and then let's make it happen."

From the nominations received, a shortlist of potential projects will then be opened to the community to vote on the best project – so that the community decides on the project that will be supported.

Nominations close on October 24th, then voting will happen throughout November with the winner announced before Christmas 2017. The winner will then receive the full rebuild treatment in 2018.



Similarly to DIY SOS, the Town Trust is also looking for companies and volunteers willing to lend a hand – or a team of hands – to support the project. We'd love to see our BID members get involved, so make sure you let us know if you are.

"For this initiative to work we need the whole community here in Stratford-upon-Avon to get behind us to ensure it delivers maximum impact," added Mr Williams.

"We're talking about a life-changing project. If you know someone who can benefit, or who can help, please get in touch as soon as possible. If the community embraces this initiative, then it could become an annual event."

# STRATFORD SAYS GOODBYE TO SLR PFTFR HALL

The acting world has paid tribute to one of Stratford's most famous names, Sir Peter Hall.

Sir Peter, founder of the RSC, died on Monday aged 86.

Tributes have poured in from across the world, including right here in Stratford, where the RSC's Artistic Director Gregory Doran said: "Sir Peter Hall was a Colossus, bestriding the British Theatre. He was a visionary.



"Not only was he a great director of theatre and opera, he was a politician who fought for the Arts. It is impossible to single out his greatest production. But his greatest legacy without doubt will be judged to be the formation of the Royal Shakespeare Company in 1961".

Peter Hall made his debut at the Shakespeare Memorial Theatre in Stratford in 1956 with Love's Labour's Lost and went on to become Artistic Director in 1960, aged 29, creating the Royal Shakespeare Company.

He handed the company on to Trevor Nunn in 1968, and took over the National Theatre in 1973 which he ran for 15 years until 1988.



# BLUE SKIES JOINING NATIONAL BODY IMAGES PROJECT WITH ARTSHOUSE SCREENING

BID member Blue Skies is taking part in a national project to combat body image issues.



The Birmingham Road-based recruitment agency is one of 2,000 people to host an event to screen Embrace: The Documentary (<a href="https://youtu.be/2AayArYfs">https://youtu.be/2AayArYfs</a>) - which explores the issue of negative body image, telling the story of Australian wife and mother Taryn Brumfitt's crusade to change the way we think and feel about our bodies.

Blue Skies' screening is being held at the ArtsHouse next Thursday (September 21st) at 7.30pm, with all profits donated to its chosen charity of the year, The Shakespeare Hospice.

The event is part of Embrace: The Union Project, which seeks 2,000 people to purchase a public licence to screen Embrace (or gift their screening to a school or community group) and contribute to body image education.

The Body Image Movement will go on to make the Embrace Education Study Guide accessible to every secondary school across the UK for free for use as a classroom resource.
